

HEAD OF SCHOOL MESSAGE

ACCREDITATION AND ASSOCIATIONS







As a school, City Schoolhouse strives to be an active contributor to our local community in order to deliver the best possible teaching and learning opportunities for our students. To assist with these goals, City Schoolhouse works with a range of partner organizations, such as Southeast Christian Church and Kosair Charities, who provide a variety of services that support our position as an independent school, enhance our offerings, or complement our community engagement.

City Schoolhouse has been awarded provisional accreditation by the Independent Schools of the Central States (ISACS). ISACS is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and provides City Schoolhouse with a highly regarded accreditation that is renowned across the country. City Schoolhouse is a neighborhood private school where students come to learn academic, social, and practical life skills. Class sizes range from 10–15 students with two teachers. We teach in developmental age groups, and our teaching is inspired by successful Montessori teaching techniques as well as other best practices for hands-on learning.

We incorporate day-to-day practical living skills that our students often do not learn at home in our daily curriculum. We want all our students to be in a place where, despite their circumstances, they are treasured — a place where they know they are created for a purpose.

SCHOOL MODEL

We are unique because we are not just there for the student, but also for their family and community. We bring the families into the class and allow them learning and growing opportunities as well. We are teaching our students the importance of kindness, respect, and responsibility to themselves and their neighbors that is lost on so many of us today.


Over time, the ripple effects of bringing people together to develop these individuals, the buildings around them, and the neighborhoods they fill, can bring light to an entire city for generations.


Cost: We are a "pay-what-you-can" school what you can not pay in treasure, you contribute in time or talent to support the school community.

EARLY CHILDHOOD HIGHLIGHTS










Our goal is to provide a rich learning environment that engages students and sparks their learning interests through handson learning experiences. We believe that learning can come naturally when students have their interests encouraged and are not rushed to have their time to explore.

Students are provided two hours of uninterrupted station time, where the teacher works as a facilitator encouraging and aiding students as they learn and explore the learning materials. Teachers monitor learning and observe as the student moves from introduction, to practicing, and finally to mastery over the information. If a student needs extra support, the teacher is available to provide assistance.

As students progress, those ready for higher learning are provided opportunities to begin working through their monthly projects and beginning passport stamps during the afternoon.

LOWER & MIDDLE SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

- Both Lower and Middle School students must work throughout the year to become profienct in all areas of school to earn learning badges. IXL and Khan Academy play a huge role in showing us where students are and what skills they can learn next.
- Mentoring is a crutial aspect of our mentoring program. Middle School students serve as learning buddies for our younger students by helping them learn to read, with their math, and how to be mature and wise members of society.
- Students spend at least 60 minutes per day outside exploring and playing on our seven acres of land behind the school. Team sports and nature walks are among several of the students' favorite ways to spend time outside.

Each Spring, students participate in several community outreach events. They plant a community garden, pick up trash around the community, and help organize community game nights and dinners. Presenters have shared about:







